In the case of SC/ST students and blind students the minimum percentage of marks required shall be less by 5%.

Soon after the interview, the candidate if selected shall be enrolled on payment of fee prescribed for each course.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Institution strongly believes in creating a just society through right education to the students. Keeping in view the betterment of the students, the management expects certain disciplinary actions from the students.

Office Hours:

The College office functions from 08:30 a.m. to 04:30. p.m on all the working days. Request for certificates, testimonials and other documents requiring the Principal's signature should be addressed to the Principal and submitted to the College Office. Certificates will not be issued without a minimum of 48 hours prior notice.

College Timing & Morning Prayer

The college appreciates and acknowledges the students' punctuality and discipline. The college opens at 8.45 am in the morning and closes at 3.00 pm in the evening. For those who have practical, the classes will be till 4.00 pm. The Students are required to enter the college premises by 8.45 am and occupy their places in the class rooms by 8.50 am. The college gates remain closed thereafter. All the students are expected to be in their classes for Prayer at 8.55 a.m. The late comers are obliged to do the assignments given to them.

Personal Discipline

Regularity, Obedience, courtesy in speech and conduct, respect for elders, cleanliness in dress and person is expected from every student. Irregular attendance, disobedience and objectionable conduct in the college will justify dismissal of the student. The personal copy of the college Handbook/calendar must be brought every day.

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ID Card

The student shall carry her ID card every day to the college and shall produce it at the gate and when required.

Attendance

80% of attendance in each subject is compulsory. Students falling short of the attendance will not be permitted to write the semester examinations. If a student is absent for an hour on a day without permission, she shall be marked absent for the whole day.

Absence & Late Comming

If a student is absent for more than six days, her name will be removed from the roll. A student who has been absent for the classes or come late will not be admitted to the class without the Principal's permission. All such permission shall be entered in the college calendar or leave card only. Students who come late will be entered on a late coming card at the gate by the Lecturers in charge/security affixing their and the student's signature.

Leave

Leave of absence will not be granted to the student except for serious reasons and prior written application from the parents or guardian. If a student absents herself without prior permission, she must bring her parent/ guardian to the college and meet the principal. The student will not be given leave for Marriage and maternity. The students can only avail the 20% leave for Medical or for any other reason. No student will be permitted to leave the college during the working hours and lunch hours.

Mobile Phones

The mobile phones are strictly prohibited in the classroom and in the college premises. If any student is found using the mobile phone, it would be confiscated or Rs. 1000 will be levied and the mobile phone will be returned at the end of the academic year. If there is an emergency the students can use the college phone available in the office.

Ragging

Ragging is a criminal offense against the Law. College would not encourage such activities in the campus; any issues related to this can be addressed to the college authorities. If any such crime found the student would be called for action i.e Cancellation of Admission, Suspension from the college and punishment.

Safety

The student is required to submit six pass port size photographs and a family photograph at the time of admission. This would ensure the safety of the student at any strange situation.

Damage

Any damage done to the college property will have to be compensated by the students. Students should not tamper with fan regulators and switch boards and must switch off the fans and lights before leaving the classrooms.

Cleanliness

Student should use the dustbins and co-operate in keeping the campus, classrooms, laboratory neat and clean.

Writing on Wall

Writing and sticking bills on college walls or on desks is strictly prohibited.

Free Hour

Students should utilize their free hours by visiting the library for reading books, Magazines and News Papers etc. available in the library.

Vehicle

Students using vehicles must possess a valid driving licence

Problem Situations

Any issues or a serious settlement of students / staff to be brought to the notice of Principal and Secretary. No other persons than parents are allowed as mediators.

Valuables & Personal Belongings

No student is permitted to bring expensive goods/ gadgets like laptops, Mobile Phones, I Phones, I pods, Jewellery and money worth more value along with them to the college. In case of losing anything of this kind, the Management will not take responsibility. The students and the Parents are expected to follow this strictly.

MISCONDUCT

Any student found to have committed the following misconduct is subject to the disciplinary actions:

- Acts of dishonesty: Cheating, plagiarism or other forms of academic dishonesty.
- Furnishing false information to any College official, faculty member or office.
- ❖ Forgery, alteration or misuse of college document, record, or instrument of identification.
- Disruption of teaching, research, administration, disciplinary proceedings, college activities when the act occurs in college premises.

- ❖ Physical assault and sexual assault, latter including all criminal sexual conduct as defined by the laws of the State.
- ❖ Attempted or actual theft of, or damage to, property of the college or property of a member of the college community or other personal or public property.
- ❖ Hazing which endangers the mental or physical health or safety of a student, or which destroys or removes public or private property, for the purpose of initiation, admission into, affiliation with, or as a condition for continued membership in a group or organization. Failure to comply with directions of college officials or law enforcement officers acting in performance of their duties and/or failure to identify oneself to these persons when requested to do so.
- Unauthorized possession, duplication or use of keys or access to any college buildings or devices is restricted. Unauthorized entry or presence within enclosed college buildings even when unlocked is prohibited.
- ❖ Violation of any college policy, rule, or regulation published in hard copy or available electronically on the college website.
- No weapons of any kind are allowed in the campus.
- ❖ Participation in campus demonstration that disrupts the normal operations of the College and infringes on the rights of members of the College community; leading or inciting others to disrupt scheduled and/or normal activities within any campus building or area; intentional obstruction which unreasonably interferes with freedom of movement, either pedestrian or vehicular, on campus.

- ❖ Profane or obscene expressions including, but not limited to speech, which violate accepted standards of decency and Christian conduct.
- ❖ Sexual misconduct including, but not limited to, sexual relations outside marriage, involvement with pornography, internet cybersex or other internet sexual misconduct.
- Students should not raise fund or make any collection in cash or any kind without the prior consent of the authority.

VIOLATION OF LAW AND COLLEGE DISCIPLINE

- When a student is charged with violation of the Student Conduct Code, the College may institute disciplinary proceedings.
- ❖ When a student is charged by state, or local authorities with a violation of law, the College will not request or agree to special consideration for that individual because of his or her status as a student. The College will cooperate fully with the law enforcement agencies in the enforcement of law.

RULES TO BE FOLLOWED IN COMPUTER LABORATORY

- 1. The back bone of SAASC is the well-equipped computer lab.
- 2. The Students should enter the lab only during their practical class.
- 3. Apart from the allotted time, if a student wants to access the lab. she has to get a written permission from the respective faculty.
- 4. One or two of the Teaching faculty must always be present in the lab to review the work of the students in a round-robin manner from their supervisory desk.

- 5. Students are not allowed to take print outs without prior permission.
- 6. Students are not allowed to enter the lab with footwear.
- 7. Personal belongings must be left in their Department. Students are responsible for their belongings.
- 8. Chairs/Keyboard/mouse/interactive console should be put back in order after use.
- 9. Strict silence has to be observed by students in the lab.
- 10. In case of technical issues/infra structural problems, students should approach the college office and thereby solve the issues.
- 11. Students cannot modify the Firmware installed. Fail to do so will cause serious malfunction of the workstation.
- 12. Students cannot delete or modify any file/files or directory / directories installed.
- 13. No computer games from any source, either hard disk, CD-ROM, Internet, etc. are at any time in the lab is strictly not allowed.

LIBRARY RULES

- ID card should be carried to the Library to access books.
- Books issued are to be returned within 8 days after which 2 renewals can be permitted
- Personnel books and files are not to be taken inside the library.
- Overdue charge is Rs.5/- per day per book.
- Maintain silence and discipline in the library.
- Library books will be issued between 12:00-12.30 pm and 2.30-4:00 pm

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- Reference books are not for circulation.
- Sign in the register when you enter the library.
- Do not make any mark with pen/pencil in the book
- Do not fold/tear the pages.
- The books taken from the shelves must be left on the table and not back on the shelves.
- Students can take 3 books from the library during the Examination for their reference.
- Renewal of books is not allowed during exams.
- Losses of borrowed books have to be reported immediately in writing to the Librarian and the same to be replaced.
- Any difficulty or grievances felt in utilizing the library should be brought to the notice of the Chief Librarian.

FEE REGULATIONS

- Fee once paid will not be refunded for any reasons.
- ❖ The student has to be alert to all the announcements with regard to paying the college fees, Exam fees and oblige to pay them on or before the stipulated date. If failed she has to pay with fine.
- ❖ The last minute payment at the time of Semester Exams will not be permitted. The students and the Parents need to accept the decision of the college in case of delay or Non Payment.

DRESS CODE

Dress code is not about what is convenient to wear as girls but convincing to wear as students of St. Anne. Hence, Students are expected to wear simple and modest clothes and they are permitted to wear Chudithar with Dupattas pinned or Jeans with long closed tops.

Good attire is a best way of presenting oneself. The Students show Indianness in dressing by not wearing tight tops, short tops, sleeveless tops, T-Shirts, skirts and three forth pants. All are expected to be modest in their attire, if any student found wearing indecent dress will be charged a fine of R.500.

RULES OF ATTENDANCE

- 1. 5 Marks per paper in every semester is being allotted for regular attendance to the classes.
- 2. Attendance is being taken at the beginning of every class hour.
- 3. Attendance is compulsory on the reopening day, closing day; seminar days, department programs, and industrial visit. Attendance is compulsory for all the special activities of the College.
- 4. Student who wishes to avail leave for one day has to get permission from the Class In-charge by a written letter, for two days from the HOD and for more days, from the Principal. Students who are absent due to illness should also produce the medical certificate.
- 5. Student can obtain monthly attendance status from the Class In-charge. Name of the students who have shortage of attendance will be displayed on the notice board at the end of every month.
- 6. Students are expected to get 100% attendance. Appreciation certificate of attendance will be issued to students those who score 100% attendance at the end of the year.

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EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION SYSTEM

The College follows the same Semester system of the Bengaluru Central University, Bengaluru.

- 1. Each semester has two periodical tests, two assignments, seminar, model exam and attendance as part of the internal assessment (30 marks Theory Paper).
- 2. Semester end University Exam (70 marks Theory Paper).
- 3. University Practical Exam is conducted at the end of each semester.
- 4. 75% of attendance is compulsory to appear for University Exam.
- 5. All the eligible students who appear for the examination for the first time in any semester should pay the examination fee in full for all the subjects whether the candidate writes the examination or not.
- 6. Students reported of malpractice in examination will be severely dealt with and even dismissed.
- 7. No student who is admitted to college is automatically eligible for the university examination. At her due discretion the Principal, may direct any student to withdraw from the examination, either to student's repeated poor performance in studies, or irregular attendance, or indulging in any unwanted activities

Minimum Pass Mark

Candidates who have obtained a minimum of 35% marks in university examination (i.e. 25 marks out of 70 marks of theory examination) and 40% in aggregate in each subject shall be eligible for a pass or exemption in that subject.

Semester Exam - 25 Marks (Out of 70)

Practical

Internal Assessment - 07 Marks (Out of 15)
Semester Exam - 13 Marks (Out of 35)

STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The students shall

- Appreciate the institution goals and objectives and contribute to the realization of the same by participating in all institutional activities.
- Have a clear knowledge of the programmes, admission policies, rules and regulations of the institution.
- Follow the time schedule, rules and regulations, undertake regular and intense study of learning materials
- Give priority to Time management and discipline inside and outside the College.
- Make optimum use of the learning resource and other support services available in the institution.
- Prepare for Internal Assessments, Tests and Semester Examinations.
- Give feedback for system improvement. Have faith and ability to pursue lifelong institution.

PRINCIPAL'S PRIOR PERMISSION IS REQUIRED

- To arrange private tuition under any one of the faculty members
- To take part in competitions in any other institutions as a student of this college.
- To join in a Sports Meet or playing in tournaments, outside the college.
- Students are not permitted to do any of the following without the prior permission from the College Management: give interviews, publish any materials, participate in live/photographic modeling fashion shows/stage shows and radio/TV Programmes.
- To raise fund for any purpose what so ever.
- To arrange meeting, party, picnic etc.
- To take leave on account of health issues and other reasons

NOTE TO PARENTS

- Parents and guardians are informed that the college does not accept donations for admission directly or indirectly. Any malpractice in this regard may be brought to the notice of the Principal immediately.
- 2. **Dress Code:** Students are expected to wear simple and modest clothes and they are permitted to wear Chudithar with Dupattas pinned or Jeans with long closed tops.
- 3. Cell Phone: Use of cell phones is banned inside the campus. Any violation of this rule may lead to the seizure of the phone. A fine of Rs. 1000/- will be imposed and the mobile phone will be returned at the end of the academic year.

- **4. ID Card:** Students should wear ID Card when they come to the college. If any student fails to wear, she will be allowed inside only on payment of penalty fee of Rs. 100.
- **5.** Late Comers are not permitted. The main gate will be closed sharply at 9.00 a.m.
- 6. Students are expected to get 80% attendance. **Appreciation Certificate of Attendance** will be issued to students those who score 100% attendance at the end of the year.
- 7. Anti-Ragging: Ragging is a serious offence and in accordance with UGC norms, ragging in any form is strictly not allowed. A student found guilty of ragging will face cancellation of admission, suspension from the college and punishment under this Act.
- 8. The Students should behave very decently. Violation of this will be informed to Parents and **Disciplinary action** will be taken immediately.
- 9. Parents are asked to **pay College fees and University Examination Fees** on time.
- 10. Parents / Guardian have to pay the college fee at the beginning of the academic year. They are requested not to give way for the college to hold the Hall tickets at the end.
- 11. Check their marks and progress in **EMS portal** of the college. Parents need to go through the Marks during PTA meet and attest their signature and take remedial measures, if needed.
- 12. Parents/Guardian may bring any **suggestion and complaints** to the notice of the Principal and not to the staff directly.
- 13. Parents/Guardian should not enter the class rooms.

- 14. Parents/Guardian should not meet the students in the college premises without the prior permission of the principal.
- 15. As **parental co-operation** is indispensable for the proper education of the children, you are requested to keep in touch with the college authorities to know the progress and conduct of the students. No third party intervention is allowed. Any grievance or issue to be smoothly handled between the college and the parents only.
- 16. Principal will be available between 10.00 am and 11.00 am or by prior appointment.

- To organise and manage resources and responsibilities for dealing with all humanitarian aspects of emergencies in order to lessen the impact of disasters and help in relief work by collecting cloths, donation, food and other necessity items.

Red Cross Wing: This wing will conduct programmes that promote Respect for Life through Anti-suicide sessions, Camps to create wealth from waste and National Integration through Peace and Justice.

Dr. Ambedkar Cell (SC & ST cell): The Cell works towards promoting equality among the students. It conducts seminars on Dr.Ambedkar and helps the students to get financial benefits from the Government.
