3. Research, Consultancy and Extension

3.1 Initiatives of the IQAC in Sensitizing/Promoting Research Climate in the institution

The Internal Quality assurance cell focuses on enhancing the quality of the institution. It is in constant pursuit of bringing in quality in all aspects of the Institution.

The cell interacts periodically with all the departments, clubs and committees suggesting them to conduct certain quality based programs and parameters to be included in their events.

IQAC suggests the department heads to encourage the students participation in academic activities. Hence the best students of each department are selected and they are sent to participate in various conferences and competitions to enhance their learning skills. This gives an impetus for higher growth of those students intellectually.

With the recommendation of IQAC, Centre for Excellence conducted a National Seminar on "Professional Ethics and Its Impact on Teaching Learning Process" on 28th September 2017.

- Many Scholars presented the papers and the same was published in an international journal: International Journal Of Trend In Research And Development. ISSN:2394-9333
- Faculty Research Programme (FRP) for the academic year 2017-2018 was organised this year also. The success of the FRP programme in the previous year motivated many lecturers to present papers on their subject. This programme was an initiative to enhance research culture among the faculty. This programme helped them to enhance the knowledge of the methodology of the paper presentation.

The Faculty Research Programme (FRP) was conducted on 27th March 2018 and it was a great success. This time 5 Subject experts had been invited to chair the presentations, assess them and to give the feedback. The Chair Persons for the FRP were - Dr. Kavitha Shasthri

Dr. Hosamani, Dr. Veena Nagaraj, Dr. L. Manjunath Rao, Dr. Jagadeesh .R. chaired the presentation and research oriented suggestions were given to each paper. A total of 46 papers were presented on the day of FRP and five parallel sessions were conducted.

- Mr.Deepu from the Department of Commerce won the best Paper Presentation award at the National Seminar Conducted by the Sacred Heart Degree College.
- PG students were motivated to present Research Papers in other Institutions during National and State Level Seminars.
- Two BCA students won the Best Paper Presentation award in St.Claret College in an International Conference on 'Trends & Innovations Implying Future Technology'.
- Dr. Raja Jeba Singh who is a Professor of Commerce in St. Joseph's Commerce of College and has several years of experience as an editor of International Journal conducted an hour's workshop for all those who have done Ph.D and those who are pursuing. He gave useful suggestions on recognizing a valid and an invalid journal. He

also recommended to surf few websites to Publish Papers in International Journals. Those websites would help them to assess the quality of the Publication Houses. He even clarified the doubts of many lecturers on the issues of Publication. He elaborated the steps involved in getting an ISSN number for the Journals.

5.6 Details of student counselling and career guidance

> Orientation Programme

• The Counselling cell organized an Orientation Programme on "Counselling Services for the Students Wellbeing" in the month of June and July 2017. In the orientation, counsellor detailed the procedures and reassured that counselling is free & confidential.

Workshop on "Work Place Interventions for Mental Health"

Counseling cell in association with NIMHANS had organized one day workshop on "Work Place Interventions for Mental Health" on 10th November 2017 from 10.30am to 3.00pm to mark World Mental Health Day. Dr. Thirumurthy, Head of Psychiatric Social work Department, Dr. Nirmala, Dr. Brinda, Dr.Seenu and Dr.Sojan were invited as the resource persons from Department of Psychiatric Social work NIMHANS. The workshop was divided into three sessions.

The first session was facilitated by Dr. Sojan, high lightened the various factors influencing Mental Health. He stressed upon the Role of Frustration in our daily lives and how it is indispensible. Knowing to manage frustration will help in balancing the work and personal lives. He explained the same with plenty of anecdotes and personal experiences which resonated well with the staff members.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- The Institution has collaborated with various corporate companies to train the students on various industry based skills.
- All the students of all the streams are given one add on programme each semester.
- Timely Workshops are conducted to enhance the skills of both the Teachers as well as the students.
- Field visit and Industrial visit is an initiative taken by all the Departments every year.
- Micro teaching
- During the Annual General Body Meeting committees and clubs are formed for the better efficiency of teaching learning process.
- Slow learners are given emphasis so that no student is left behind in the learning process.
- Faculty is constantly motivated to present and publish Research Papers in conferences and seminars at various levels.
- Either the IQAC or the Centre for Excellence conducts a National Seminar to enhance the skills of the Teachers.
- Apart from all these all the Departments conducts frequent guest lectures, field visits, lecture competitions and many other programmes..

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Internal Examinations are conducted at regular intervals for each semester
- Internal Assessment of the updated marks, attendance and assignments is calculated online by EMS, so that the transparency is maintained without any bias towards any student.
- The University conducts Semester Examinations for all the streams.
- 85% of the Eligible Lecturers are deputed for University Evaluation.
- Lecturers are sent as External Practical Examiners.
- Lecturers are also deputed as VIVA- VOCE external examiners for Projects

6.3.4 Research and Development

- A Faculty Development Programme was organized by IQAC on 9th September. Mr. Prasad.K, a trainer in Analytics was the resource person who enlightened the staff on the Topics: <u>Data Management</u>, <u>Analytical tools available in SPSS and Interpreting Result Analysis</u>. It was a day's programme conducted in the Computer Lab. A hands on practice session helped each staff to work practically with a computer, by learning the data collection process and analysis tools. It was an informative and interactive session.
- ➤ Either the IQAC or the Centre for Excellence conducts a National Seminar to enhance the Research skills of the Teachers. This year the Centre for Excellence team organised a National Seminar on 28th September, 2017. The Title of the Conference was 'Professional Ethics and its Impact on Teaching Learning Process." The Papers which were presented during the Conference was published in an International Journal 'International Journal of Trend in Research and Development" ISSN: 2394-9333.
- ➤ Dr. Raja Jeba Singh who is a Professor of Commerce in St. Joseph's College of Commerce and has several years of experience as an editor of International Journal conducted an hour's workshop for all those who have done Ph.D and those who are pursuing. He gave useful suggestions on recognizing a valid and an invalid journal. He also recommended to surf few websites to Publish Papers in International Journals. Those websites would help them to assess the quality of the Publication Houses. He even clarified the doubts of many lecturers on the issues of Publication. He elaborated the steps involved in getting an ISSN number for the Journals.
- ➤ IQAC conducted a Faculty Research Programme where all the Lecturers had to present one Research Paper, which is an initiative to enhance Research Culture amongst the faculty. This time it was conducted under the guidance of a subject expert with respect to each department from other colleges and all the Departments presented their papers which was analyzed and guided by those subject experts. Simultaneous Presentations at five venues were highly beneficial to the staff.
- ➤ Under the guidance of IQAC, faculty came forward to register for Ph. D and this is a great improvement both for the staff as well as for the Institution.
- ➤ Management promotes the publication of Papers at various levels i.e. in State, National, International Journals and publications.
- Management also encourages the faculty to participate in conferences and seminars conducted by various organisations to inculcate the research culture amongst the staff.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

ICT

- College has allotted one hall as AV hall with projectors and speakers for small conferences and seminars
- Several computers have been replaced with the new ones installing latest software for the benefit of the staff and students.
- The students of all the courses are given add on programs based on the latest information technology.
- Staff was given SPSS programme which is very useful in their Research endeavours.
- Teaching faculty was given special workshops to enable them in enhancing the ability to use technology in their teaching techniques.

PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

- This year 10 more class rooms were constructed.
- Some of the class rooms were allotted for the PG department exclusively.
- AV room with projector and speaker has been allotted to conduct small seminars and conferences.
- A common room has been built based on the recommendation of the NAAC committee for the comfort of the students.
- Spacious Sports room is allotted with necessary equipment and facilities required.
- A separate staff room is allotted for the PG staff.

LIBRARY

- Library purchased 579 books to the library with the cost of Rs.2,79,383/-, journals and magazines at Rs.62,000/- Institutional membership with British Council at Rs.10,000/- and Newspaper at Rs.28,000/-
- A Library exclusively for PG students is allotted in the PG Block for the benefit of the students as it is in the same floor.
- E-books & e- journals can be accessed through N-List & it is renewed periodically. The students and the staff are trained by the librarian to use the e-library efficiently.

• User Awareness Programme – 07.07.2017

The library & Information Center, organized User Awareness Program for new entrants 07 July 2017 to bring in awareness to the students about the facilities and supporting system offered such as Xerox facility, INFLIBNET, Institutional membership, circulation details etc.

Books Exhibition – 11.09.2017

• Renewal of Institutional Membership- 13.03.2018

The library got British council institutional membership on 13 March 2018 to facilitate the students to wide range of books at British Council division. Under this scheme, students are issued membership cards and they are allowed to borrow two books on a card. Besides, they are also eligible for borrowing two CDs, 10 periodicals, 10 children books, 2 DVDs and free internet access.

• Library Quiz – 16.02.2018

On 16th Feb 2018, the department organized a Library quiz to make students to become active users of the resources available in the library, to update their knowledge on regular basis.

7.3 Give two Best Practices of the institution (please see the format in the NAAC Self-study Manuals)

The Institution has continued the Best Practices of the Previous years and has introduced some of the extra Best Practices.

Best Practice I:

- 1. Title of the Practice Mid Day Meal Programme
- 2. Goal To support the students who attend classes without Lunch Box.
- 3) **The Context** This programme was initiated to support those students who stay hungry without getting their lunch boxes. Many students were found not having lunch during the lunch break. The Social Leadership Committee took an initiative to provide lunch for those students who can't afford to have three meals a day.
- 4). The practice- To support the students who stayed hungry many students were encouraged to get an extra lunch box and they were asked to leave it in the Watch Man's Cabin. This method did not give much result. Later the Social Leadership Committee along with the management decided to cook hot and fresh food. This turned out to be a great success and many students started taking the lunch directly from the place where it is provided.
- 5) **Evidence of Success**-The students have started liking the food which is being prepared in the college and the response is very good. Many students have given their names and taking the food from the place where it is supplied.
- 6) **Problems encountered and resources required** There were various challenges to have this practice.
 - The students were not willing to give their names initially
 - To cook the food necessary things such as gas stove, grocery etc was difficult to arrange.
 - Many MNCs came forward and sponsored the requirements.
 - The sponsored items can lost upto one year.

Best Practice II:

Title of the Practice: Mother Gnanamma Educational Fund

2. **Goal**:

- To support the under privileged students to pursue their education.
- To inculcate the nature of contributing for a social cause.

3. The Context:

A Committee is formed to process the educational fund for the students from the economically weaker section. During the orientation programme, Students are informed about mother Gnanamma educational fund and that the fund is raised with one rupee contribution a day by each student. In the process, Many students have volunteered for this noble cause.

4. The practice:

- 1. Class Representatives of each class take initiative to collect one rupee from each student.
- 2. Students in large numbers have volunteered towards this cause
- 3. Institution has maintained an individual account for this purpose.
- 4. During the General body meeting, the Staff secretary gives an account of this fund.
- 5. The staff are also encouraged to contribute towards the same.
- 6. For the past two years, Students who could not afford to pay the fees were given financial assistance through this fund.
- 7. The family background of these students are verified after which the financial assistance is provided.

5. Evidence of Success:

- 1. Students who received financial assistance were able to continue their education without any financial obstacles.
- 2. The Success of this program inspired few other economically poor students to seek help without any hesitation.
- 3. In view of the success of this program, it has been continued to assist the poor students.

6. Problems encountered and resources required:

- 1. Some students wanted the details of the benefactors, since the account was not revealed to the students for the safety of the benefactor.
- 2. Few students wanted to contribute directly and not through the class representatives. This became tedious to account.

Best Practice III:

1. **Title of the Practice**: One month workshop for young school children.

2. **Goal**:

Preparing students for the workforce is one goal of education today. The main aim of this practice is to achieve the goal of —SKILL DEVELOPMENT & COMPUTER LITERACY program through —FREE COMPUTER EDUCATION in a nearby school —RBANMS Thirukulathur School, Ulsoor II. Excellent education was provided free of cost.

3. The Context:

The only way to adequately prepare children for the future is through computer education classes that equip students about computers and technology. Since almost all jobs now and in the future will require students to use technology in some form, students need to begin learning the basics of how computers work and how technology enhances life.

4. The practice:

- Idea conceived in HOD meeting
- Identifying nearby schools
- Framing the syllabus.

The workshop was improvised with better facilities provided by the school. Twelve computers were provided by the school. Eleven girls were selected from final year BCA who will be going once in a week i.e. for 4 hours in a month. Students were very enthusiastic to learn computers. Overall it was fruitful because the students were very enthusiastic to learn computers. The students were taught Desktop basics, MS-Paint.

5. Evidence of Success:

It was a successful workshop, the students were happy. The school management has appreciated our college students' work. The syllabus was completed on time. Oral assessment was done to test the outcome of the workshop which came out to be positive. The school management has invited us for teaching in next semester.

6. Problems encountered and resources required:

There were various challenges in the workshop such as power failure in the school which was a major constraint for the girls to wind the class on time. The computers also were very obsolete.

- Power distribution was very poor because school did not have any backup. Our college students faced a problem because of power failure.
- Obsolete computers —The computers were not updated with the latest version and it was not working properly.
- Some of them were of the opinion that this workshop is a waste of time.
- Absence of trained teachers There were no trained computer teachers in that school.

- 7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection
 - Eco club celebrated Environment day on 18th July 2017. The central theme of the day was medicinal plants and their importance.
 - A skit on the importance of forests was enacted by the eco club members. The skit show
 cased the productive and consumptive value of the forest and the need to preserve forests
 and wildlife.
 - Eco club members performed a dance on environment to bring awareness about the Environment among the students.
 - An exhibition on medicinal plants and plant products and the students were made known about some of the medicinal plants and their importance in our daily life. The eco club members exhibited a variety of medicinal plants and plant products which included Tulsi, aloevera, Neem, Hibiscus, curry leaves, radish, broccoli, brinjal, Papaya, green tea, fenugreek seeds, pepper, cardamom, ginger, garlic, onion, lemon, bitter gourd etc. Participants had also made a decoction out of the essential spices. Another participant had made bajji out of karpooravalli (Plectranthus amboinicus), Indian Borage in traditional medicine, being used to treat malarial fever, hepatopathy, renal and vesical calculi, helminthiasis, colic, convulsions, and epilepsy.
