It gives me immense pleasure to present the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Report of our college. With great pride I want to share with you the success of our students and the experience in achieving them. As I look back, this academic year 2016-2017 has brought many accomplishments.

**Introduction:** We are happy that ten batches of students completed the degree course from our institution and graduated successfully. We had eight new faculty members joining our institution at the beginning of the year.

## **History of Education at St Anne's**

Today we have over 1122 students pursuing 6 UG courses. It brings waves of emotions when I take you down the memory lane... a journey that began with 152 students in 2005 to pursue 5 UG courses. The curriculum growth of UG courses indicates a continuous journey beyond the threshold of mediocrity to soar into an ever-continuing explorative experience in quality education. We have been accredited by NAAC with a CGPA of 2.52 last year.

It is proposed to offer new PG courses in M.Com and MA (Eng Lit) the next academic year.

#### **Academic Excellence and Achievements**

At the undergraduate level, our Commerce students secured 95 % pass percentage, BBM- 64%, B.C.A- 70%, B.Sc- 76%, Bsc (Rehab) -71%, B.A – 67%. Our B.Com student Darshini R brought glory to the college for academic excellence by securing the overall 3rd Rank in the Bangalore University Examination and was awarded GOLD MEDAL for securing 3rd Rank in Cost Accounting in Vth semester B. Com Examination. This year 45 students secured 100% in various subjects of B.Com, BCA and B.Sc. I congratulate each one of them and I am sure the present outgoing students of UG will emulate and excel even further. Out of 335 students appeared 229 students have passed all subjects. 205 Students completed their Course in First Class with Distinction 66 Students with First Class. The aggregate Pass Percentage is **89 %.** 

Ms. Ramya II B.Com student has brought laurels to our college by getting selected in the National Level Hockey team.

Ms. Sophia, II BCA student has excelled in NCC. She attended the combined annual training programme and also participated in the Republic Day Parade at New Delhi.

You will be glad to know that St Anne's has a continuous evaluation system. We conduct Tests & Assignments at knowledge level, Group discussions, Seminars, Quiz at comprehension level and Case studies, Projects, Computer Programming at analytical level. Exams are structured with unit tests and term exams. Pre-final Theory and Practical exams are held to prepare students for the University exams. IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell)-The internal quality assurance cell, constituted in June 2014 carried out streamlining and improving various systems and procedures.

Placement Record –The excellent academic records of our students do not end with the results. They get translated into fruitful career in several corporate. A few others pursue entrepreneurship in family business. I have the pleasure to inform that 10 leading corporates – from Banking, IT, Financial, HR sectors like White Horse Consultancy, Infosys, Mphasis, have selected 152 students. The maximum CTC was 3 lakhs and minimum CTC was 1.5 lakhs p.a. To enable placement as an on-going process, the college initiated industry-institution interaction and collaboration with several firms to conduct company academic linkages. TCS has signed a MOU with our college for training and placement.
